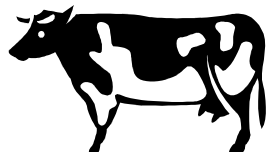

Send a Cow

works with rural community groups in 8 countries in Africa besides Ethiopia, providing small-scale farmers with the skills and means to feed their families and earn an income.

One essential aspect of the work is the pass-on principle, by which farmers pass on the benefits (e.g. the first female offspring of their livestock and the skills they have learned) to another family, so the work goes on multiplying.
